City Council,

In advance of tomorrow's Council discussion, the Boulder Shelter for the Homeless would like to thank the City for its support of the Shelter and of Homeless Solutions for Boulder County (HSBC) over the past few years. We continue to provide services to those experiencing homelessness from a collaborative, evidence-based approach, which has been paying dividends. For example, in FY2019, **the Shelter helped 119 individuals move back into stable housing**. This was a record for the Shelter and almost double the number from two years ago. We were saddened by the fact that 48 people were recognized at the homeless memorial this year. While almost half of those named were housed when they passed, it is a reminder that there is still work to be done. Here are some other highlights:

- HSBC, a result of a City-led facilitation in 2016, has provided much needed structure that has significantly increased the collaboration between City staff, County staff and Boulder County homeless service providers.
- Boulder County Connect, the database being used by HSBC, is now supplying, for the first time, accurate regional data about those experiencing homelessness. This is important because we can now coordinate efforts on an individual basis.
- A combination of the Coordinated Entry process and increased housing exits has led to a reduction in nightly residents at the Shelter. This has reduced our capacity turn aways to zero and will allow Navigation clients to move from 30<sup>th</sup> St. to the Shelter in June, which will save limited resources.
- With the City's help, the Shelter has moved from supporting 54 countywide clients in Permanent Supportive Housing to more than 90. And, more than 60 more units/vouchers are in the works for 2020/2021.

In 2020, the Shelter will continue to expand stable housing solutions for those experiencing homelessness; because we know the solution to homelessness is housing. We are also excited about providing new Diversion services as well as Navigation bed and Navigation case management services starting in June of 2020 when the 30<sup>th</sup> street facility shuts down. We are optimistic that those experiencing homelessness will benefit as we focus on long-term solutions rather than temporary fixes. We encourage you to continue to support the current direction for homeless services in our community.

As you may have heard, at a little past midnight last night, the city council voted 6 to 2 to place on the November ballot the opportunity for the Boulder voters to decide whether to accept the settlement proposal negotiated with Xcel Energy, or to continue the decade-long municipalization litigation. Many thanks to those who wrote to city council, encouraging them to place the settlement proposal on the ballot. And double thanks to those who spoke to council at the public hearing last night. Your written and spoken advocacy made a difference.

On September 1, city council will take one more procedural vote to place the measure on the ballot. Barring an unexpected change of mind by council members, this should happen without much drama. Hi Bob,

My apologies--I had a small typo in one of the pieces of guidance. Here's the corrected list:

- **DO** bag and tie your trash: this protects our workers from handling infectious trash and causing inadvertent transmission.
- **DO** empty and rinse all liquids from recyclables: residual liquids can carry viruses and bacteria.

- **DO** observe social distancing with Western's workforce: for the health and safety of our essential workers, please keep at least a 6ft distance.
- **DO** put contaminated tissues and paper towels directly in the trash: it's important to properly dispose of tissue and paper towels used by quarantined individuals.
- **DON'T** recycle used medical masks, protective gloves and other PPE: residential customers can safely dispose of personal protective equipment in the trash.
- **DON'T** put disinfecting wipes in your compost: the chemicals destroy the good bacteria required for successful composting.
- **DON'T** bag recyclables: the bags can accumulate residual liquids that can carry viruses and bacteria.
